


Book Club:

SCHOOL SPORT CODES as extracted from the Moura SS Prospectus 2023:

PLAYERS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- 1. Play by the rules.
- 2. Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach the official during a break or after the competition.
- 3. Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials, sledging other players or deliberately.
- 4. Distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any sport.
- Work equally hard for yourself and/or your team.
 Your team's performance will benefit and so will you.
- 6. Be a good sport. Applaud all good plays whether they are made by your team or the opposition.
- 7. Treat all participants in your sport as you like to be treated. Do not bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor.
- 8. Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit, not 8. just to please your parents and coaches.
- 9. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

SPECTATORS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- 1. Remember that young people participate in sport for their enjoyment and benefit, not yours.
- 2. Applaud good performances and efforts from all individuals and teams. Congratulate all participants on their performance, regardless of the game's outcome.
- 3. Respect the decisions of officials and teach young people to do the same.
- 5. Never ridicule or scold a young player for making a mistake. Positive comments are motivational.
- 6. Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, coaches, officials or players.
- 7. Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them, there would be no game.
- 8. Encourage players to follow the rules and the officials' decisions.
- 9. Do not use foul language, sledge or harass players, coaches or officials.
- 10. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.

Inappropriate and irresponsible behaviour by any parent/carer/spectator, teacher/coach or participant will not be tolerated.

PARENTS' CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

- 1. Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not yours.
- 2. Encourage children to participate, do not force them.
- 3. Focus on your child's efforts and performance rather than whether they win or lose.
- 4. Encourage children to play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- 5. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- 6. Remember that children learn best by example. Appreciate good performance and skilful plays by all participants.
- 7. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
 - Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- 9. Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.

Cricket Gala Day

Banana SS, Friday 24 March

Tomorrow, 10am—2.30pm

Morning tea items will be available for CASH ONLY. Students are to meet on the oval via the back gate for a roll call at 9:30am. Games should start at 10am and finish with a small presentation around 2pm.

Players will need:

- School (blue school shirt) uniform, school hat, running footwear
- Water bottle or 2 and sunscreen
- Lunch and/or snacks in an esky bag

Students travelling with parents can go straight to Banana where a roll will be marked.



Cross Country Tuesday 28th March

The students are looking forward to the Annual Cross Country on Tuesday. Students born in 2011 and 2012 will run 3km and students born in 2013 and 2014 will run 2km. The action will be starting straight away in the morning with students beginning the day with rolls and notices at 8:50am and then making their way to the hall at 8:55am (so please make sure your students are at school ready to go!). We are hoping to get the action started straight away with war cries as we will be trialling something new with all classes having a run. The junior classes will still participate in the obstacle course.

The morning will begin with 2011 Girls and once they have passed the netball fields then Yr 3S and four students from Y3/4H will have a 2 lap race on the top oval. Then followed by the 2011 Boys. Once they are passed the netball fields, Yr 2/3S will have a 2 lap race on the top oval. Next will be 2012 Girls and Yr 2H having a 2 lap race, followed by 2012 Boys and Yr 1F having a 1 lap race. After the older students have completed their 3km races the 2013 Girls will have a 2km race and so will Prep/1R with a 1 lap race. Followed by 2013 Boys and Prep 0. Then we will finish with our last two races for the carnival with 2014 Girls and then 2014 Boys.

The P and C will be selling some items through the hall canteen. However no students are to go to the canteen area, students are required to sit with their house companions and cheer if they are not racing. Your understanding is appreciated, thank you.
